Julian Slavin Jacob Kenny The New Music Ensemble is dedicated to performing contemporary works by living composers and members of the ensemble. In its inaugural semester, it seems fitting to perform Terry Riley's seminal work, "In C," as the centerpiece of the evening. This open instrumentation work allows for an ensemble of any size and instrumentation to gather and play short melodic fragments repeated at the discretion of the performers. Together, the ensemble creates an interlocking pattern that is unique to each time it is performed. "In C" is often cited as the first minimalist composition to reach significance to a larger public audience. It is probably performed some place every day by any assortment of musicians of different instrumentations and musical backgrounds.

"In C" was premiered Nov. 4, 1964 at the San Francisco Tape Center. Two of the performers involved in the world premiere were Steve Reich and Pauline Oliveros, whose works are also featured on tonight's program. The idea of a repetitive C pulse that becomes the metronome of the work was first suggested by Steve Reich, which radically changed the piece into a pulse-driven work. Oliveros and Riley met in the same composition class in 1956 at San Francisco State College and became lifelong friends. They explored ideas of improvisation and both contributed key innovations to the San Francisco Tape Center. Though "In C" is not a "tape" work, the use of loops is central to how the piece is constructed. We can feel the spirit of community and collaboration in these stories of "In C." Using this beautiful structure as a model, the ensemble will create and compose their own version of "In D" later in the semester.

For spring 2025, the New Music Ensemble will feature a world premiere by our 2025 Davenport Artist, Nathan Davis. Students will perform a new work Davis writes specifically for the ensemble, along with some of his other electro-acoustic works.
