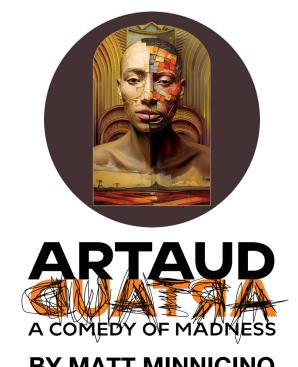

ABOUT **ARTAUD ARTAUD**



Written by Matt Minnicino, *Artaud Artaud* follows the French artist and avant-garde theater pioneer, who finds himself locked in a sanitarium with his Double—his complete opposite—whom Artaud has tasked with presenting as himself so he can focus on writing. The show centers on the complex relationship between Artaud, a preeminent theatrical sensation, and his free-spirited Double, while they each discover a sense of self and find their respective desires at odds with each other.

Written in 2015, *Artaud Artaud* was previously performed at Pershing Square Signature Center in New York City; James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Virginia; and at the Theater for the New City's Dream Up Festival in New York City.

A note from our Dramaturgs, Christopher Etienne & Milly Camara

"NO MORE MASTERPIECES." -Antonin Artaud Poet, Visionary, some might say madmen

In Artaud Artaud, the playwright Matt Minnicino reimagines all of Antonin Artaud's thoughts and creates not just a reverent biography but also a genrebending coming of age story that centers a man whose life blurred the boundaries between madness, pain, art, performance, ritual, and can't forget reality. In this play, Artaud and his double are not so much two characters as they are a fragment of one's imagination.

Artaud Artaud is a play that holds a special space in the culture of the SUNY New Paltz Department of Theatre Arts. Many of the students working on this production read this play for the first time in our Play Analysis course. The significance of reading this play is twofold: it is loosely based on the life of the playwright Antonin Artaud, and is written using elements from Bertolt Brecht's style of theatre. Minnicino's play doesn't just tell the audience about Artaud; it transports the audience into a massive whirlwind and by doing so honors the hallmarks of Brecht from irony to alienation to structure. It is a theatrical paradox at its best!

However, why this play, why now? It's because we still are perhaps even more than ever asking the same question Artaud has preached about in their past. "What is art for?" In an age filled with spectacle, unique personas and overstimulation, Artaud's vision of a theatre continues to shock and stir the uncomfortable tension that it can produce when it's seen by an audience. Art doesn't have to be comforting; there's beauty within the rage and failure of it all. If anything, it's confronting. This play doesn't really offer easy answers, because when art is being performed, it never should.

DRAMTURG NOTE (CONT'D)

During the years we spent inside at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, many of us sought enrichment from artistic pursuits, much like Artaud during his time isolated at the sanatorium in Rodez. It was a time that changed how we interacted socially and brought us a new normal. It was an opportunity to take a personal inventory and get to know oneself, whether you wanted to or not. It was also a time of pain, and yet despite the separation, the fear, and the stress, theatre persisted, and found new ways to operate remotely. It goes to show how intrepid storytellers will find a way through the most dire circumstances. Taking

place at a time when France was caught in a deadly conflict, and fascism was threatening to take over Europe, the setting of *Artaud Artaud* is one filled with pain and isolation. Yet, even in the Sanitorium at Rodez, theatre was being made.

In a world like today that is increasingly molded by conformity, commodification, and the constant response of social media, *Artaud Artaud* is a pressing reminder that art holds power. Matt Minnicino's writing does a fantastic job of channeling Antonin Artaud's very raw and camp approach to storytelling. In an era where we're witnessing truth often being distorted, this play is making sure to stay away from being comfortable by challenging audience members to see what it means to feel and feel as a human. Art should disturb, provoke, arouse our emotions, and expand our sympathies in directions that we may not anticipate nor may not even wish.

ABOUT THE **PLAYWRIGHT**



Matt Minnicino (he/they) is a queer Jewish theatre-maker who writes little myths and calls them plays. He is a Jeffrey Melnick Award and Helen Hayes nominee; winner of the Arts and Letters Prize and David Einhorn Memorial Playwriting Prize; and an alumnus of the Great Plains Theatre Conference, SPACE on Ryder Farm, Project Y, Primary Stages' Writers Group, Pipeline's PlayLab, Fresh Ground Pepper's PlayGroup, and others. He has adapted numerous classic texts and written and directed for film (with several awardwinning shorts), dance-theatre, immersive pieces and installation art. He cofounded the COVID-related initiative Theatre Without Theater and served as the Dramatists Guild's literary assistant. His essays have been published by HowlRound Theatre Commons, The Dramatist and others. He currently teaches high school in Manhattan.

ABOUT THE **DIRECTOR**



Currently an assistant professor of theatre arts at SUNY New Paltz, **Tony Speciale is** the founder of Plastic Theatre—conceiving, coauthoring and directing the Off-Broadway world premiere of "Unnatural Acts" (Classic Stage Company—Drama Desk Award nominee, GLAAD Media Award nominee). From 2015-2018, Speciale—a recipient of a Princess Grace Theatre Honorarium and Suzi Bass Award—served as artistic director of Abingdon Theatre Company, an off-Broadway theatre company dedicated to developing and producing new work. His many NYC credits include "Mister Miss America"; "A Midsummer Night's Dream" featuring Bebe Neuwirth, Taylor Mac, Christina Ricci, and Steven Skybell; and "The Boy Who Danced On Air," among others. His regional credits, to name just a few, include "Angels in America: Millennium Approaches & Perestroika" at the Repertory Theatre of St. Louis in Missouri; a national tour of "The Absolute Brightness of Leonard Pelkey"; and "Romeo and Juliet" with the Actors Theatre of Louisville in Kentucky.

As a solo writer, his play "Delirium" was presented at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in Scotland, where it was honored with a British Writers' Guild Award. Speciale spent four seasons at New York City's Classic Stage Company as associate artistic director, where he helped found, direct and teach for their award-winning education and outreach initiative, the Young Company. He studied musical theatre at the Boston Conservatory and holds a Master of Fine Arts in directing from Columbia University.
